



# POLICY

## ATTENDANCE

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### PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to:

- ensure all children of compulsory school age are enrolled in a registered school and attend school every day the school is open for instruction
- ensure students, staff and parents/carers have a shared understanding of the importance of attending school
- explain to school staff and parents the key practices and procedures Mansfield Secondary College has in place to:
  - support, monitor and maintain student attendance
  - record, monitor and follow up student absences.

### SCOPE

This policy applies to all students at Mansfield Secondary College.

This policy should be read in conjunction with the Department of Education and Training's [School Attendance Guidelines](#). It does not replace or change the obligations of Mansfield Secondary College, parents and School Attendance Officers under legislation or the School Attendance Guidelines.

### DEFINITION

*Parent* – includes a guardian and every person who has parental responsibility for the child, including parental responsibility under the *Family Law Act 1975 (Cth)* and any person with whom a child normally or regularly resides.

### POLICY

Schooling is compulsory for children and young people aged from 6 to 17 years (unless an exemption from attendance or enrolment has been granted).

Daily attendance is important for all children and young people to succeed in education and to ensure they do not fall behind both socially and developmentally. School participation maximises life opportunities for children and young people by providing them with education and support networks. School helps people to develop important skills, knowledge and values that set them up for further learning and participation in their community.

Students are expected to attend Mansfield Secondary College during normal school hours every day of each term unless:

- there is an approved exemption from school attendance for the student
- the student has a dual enrolment with another school and has only a partial enrolment in Mansfield Secondary College, or
- the student is registered for home schooling and has only a partial enrolment in Mansfield Secondary College for particular activities.

Both schools and parents have an important role to play in supporting students to attend school every day.

Mansfield Secondary College believes all students should attend school all day, every day when the school is open for instruction and is committed to working with its school community to encourage and support full school attendance.

Our school will identify individual students or cohorts who are vulnerable and whose attendance is at risk and/or declining and will work with these students and their parents to improve their attendance through a range of interventions and supports.



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Students are committed to attending school every day, arriving on time and are prepared to learn. Our students are encouraged approach a teacher and seek assistance if there are any issues that are affecting their attendance.

Mansfield Secondary College parents are committed to ensuring their child/children attend school on time every day when instruction is offered, to communicating openly with the school and providing valid explanations for any absence.

Parents will communicate with the relevant staff at Mansfield Secondary College about any issues affecting their child's attendance and work in partnership with the school to address any concerns.

Parents will provide a reasonable explanation for their child's absence from school and endeavour to schedule family holidays, appointments and other activities outside of school hours.

### Supporting and Promoting Attendance

Mansfield Secondary College's *Student Wellbeing and Engagement Policy* supports student attendance.

### Recording Attendance

Mansfield Secondary College must record attendance in every class. This is necessary to:

- meet legislative requirements
- discharge Mansfield Secondary College's duty of care for all students
- meet Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority requirements for VCE students

Attendance will be recorded by the classroom teacher at the start of each lesson using Xuno.

If students are in attendance at a school approved activity, the teacher in charge of the activity will record them as being present.

### Recording Absences

For absences where there is no exemption in place, a parent must provide an explanation on each occasion to the school.

Parents should notify Mansfield Secondary College of absences by filling in an absence note or contacting the general office by phone

If a student is absent on a particular day and the school has not been previously notified by a parent, or the absence is otherwise unexplained, Mansfield Secondary College will notify parents by text message. MSC will attempt to contact parents as soon as practicable on the same day of the unexplained absence, allowing time for the parent to respond.

If contact cannot be made with the parent (due to incorrect contact details), the school will attempt to make contact with any emergency contact/s nominated on the student's file held by the school, where possible, on the day of the unexplained absence.

Mansfield Secondary College will keep a record of the reason given for each absence. The principal will determine if the explanation provided is a **reasonable excuse** for the purposes of the parent meeting their responsibilities under the *Education Training Reform Act 2006* and the School Attendance Guidelines.

If Mansfield Secondary College considers that the parent has provided a **reasonable excuse** for their child's absence the absence will be marked as '**excused absence**'.

If the school determines that no reasonable excuse has been provided, the absence will be marked as '**unexcused absence**'.

The Principal has the discretion to accept a reason given by a parent for a student's absence. The Principal will generally excuse:

- medical and dental appointments, where out of hours appointments are not possible or appropriate

- bereavement or attendance at the funeral of a relative or friend of the student, including a student required to attend Sorry Business
- school refusal, if a plan is in place with the parent to address causes and support the student's return to school
- cultural observance if the parent/carer notifies the school in advance
- family holidays where the parent notifies the school in advance

If no explanation is provided by the parent within 10 school days of an absence, it will be recorded as an 'unexplained absence' and recorded on the student's file.

Parents will be notified if an absence has not been excused.

### **Managing Non-attendance and Supporting Student Engagement**

Where absences are of concern due to their nature or frequency, or where a student has been absent for more than five days, Mansfield Secondary College will work collaboratively with parents, the student, and other professionals, where appropriate, to develop strategies to improve attendance, including:

- establishing an Attendance Student Support Group
- implementing a Return to School Plan
- implementing an Individual Education Plan
- implementing a Student Absence Learning Plan for students who will be absent for an extended period
- arranging for assistance from relevant year level coordinator

We understand from time to time that some students will need additional supports and assistance, and in collaboration with the student and their family, will endeavour to provide this support when it is required,

### **Referral to School Attendance Officer**

If Mansfield Secondary College decides that it has exhausted strategies for addressing a student's unsatisfactory attendance, we may, in accordance with the School Attendance Guidelines refer the non-attendance to a School Attendance Officer in the North Eastern Regional Office for further action.

If, from multiple attempts to contact with a parent, it becomes apparent that a student will not be returning to the school, the principal may make a referral to a School Attendance Officer if:

- the student has been absent from school on at least five full days in the previous 12 months where:
  - the parent has not provided a reasonable excuse for these absences; and
  - measures to improve the student's attendance have been undertaken and have been unsuccessful
- the student's whereabouts are unknown and:
  - the student has been absent for 10 consecutive school days; or
  - no alternative education destination can be found for the student.

### **POLICY IMPLEMENTATION**

Daily attendance officer monitors the attendance monitoring procedures.

### **Attendance Monitoring Process**

- Staff are required to electronically complete a roll for each period.
- The daily attendance officer maintains all foreseen absences to ensure rolls are updated and current.
- Parents receive a text message prior to recess notifying of their child's absence if the absence is not a parent condoned or school activity absence.
- Year level coordinators monitor absences that are not accounted for by parent notification.
- The daily attendance officer ensures that rolls are completed by staff, including casual relief teaching staff.

### Students Leaving the Premises

Students must be supervised whilst on the school property during recess and lunch. For students who seek to leave school premises during lunch or recess a written parent/guardian requests for students under 18 must be provided.

The following procedure requests for a student to be collected from school during school hour:

- Parent Collection – Parents are to collect their child from school or authorise a relative or friend to collect their child.
- Year 12 students must sign out if they are leaving the property during study periods.
- The school only allows students to be collected by their parents (subject to any specific court orders) or by a person who has been authorised by the parents to pick up their child.
- If the authorised person collecting the child is not known to the school, verification of identity using suitable photo identification must be sighted by school personnel.
- The school records the details of when a student has been collected early from school including the:
  - ♣ date and time
  - ♣ reason for the collection

### REVIEW CYCLE AND EVALUATION

This policy was last updated on 27 July 2020 and is scheduled for review in July 2023.

### RATIONALE

All children enrolling at our school deserve a smooth transition that enables them to become part of our school with a minimum of disruption and maximum support.

### AIMS

To provide an efficient process of enrolment that satisfies the needs of both students and the school.

### IMPLEMENTATION

- All children who are eligible to attend a Victorian Government school are welcome to attend our school.
- Information regarding the enrolment of overseas students can be obtained from the International Student Program (03) 9637 2990.
- Students with Disabilities and Impairments will be enrolled along with all other eligible children. Concerns relating to resourcing levels are in themselves insufficient grounds for delayed admission. Delayed admissions can only be authorised by the Regional Director.
- All enrolments will require the completion of the Department of Education 'Confidential Student Information Enrolment Form', with details entered immediately on CASES21.
- We will contact previous schools of all students seeking transfers to:
  - discuss the circumstances of the transfer
  - to seek a transfer note or an immunisation certificate (if enrolling)
  - and to discuss any academic or behavioural matters
- Students will be allocated to classes according to a combination of class size and student need.
